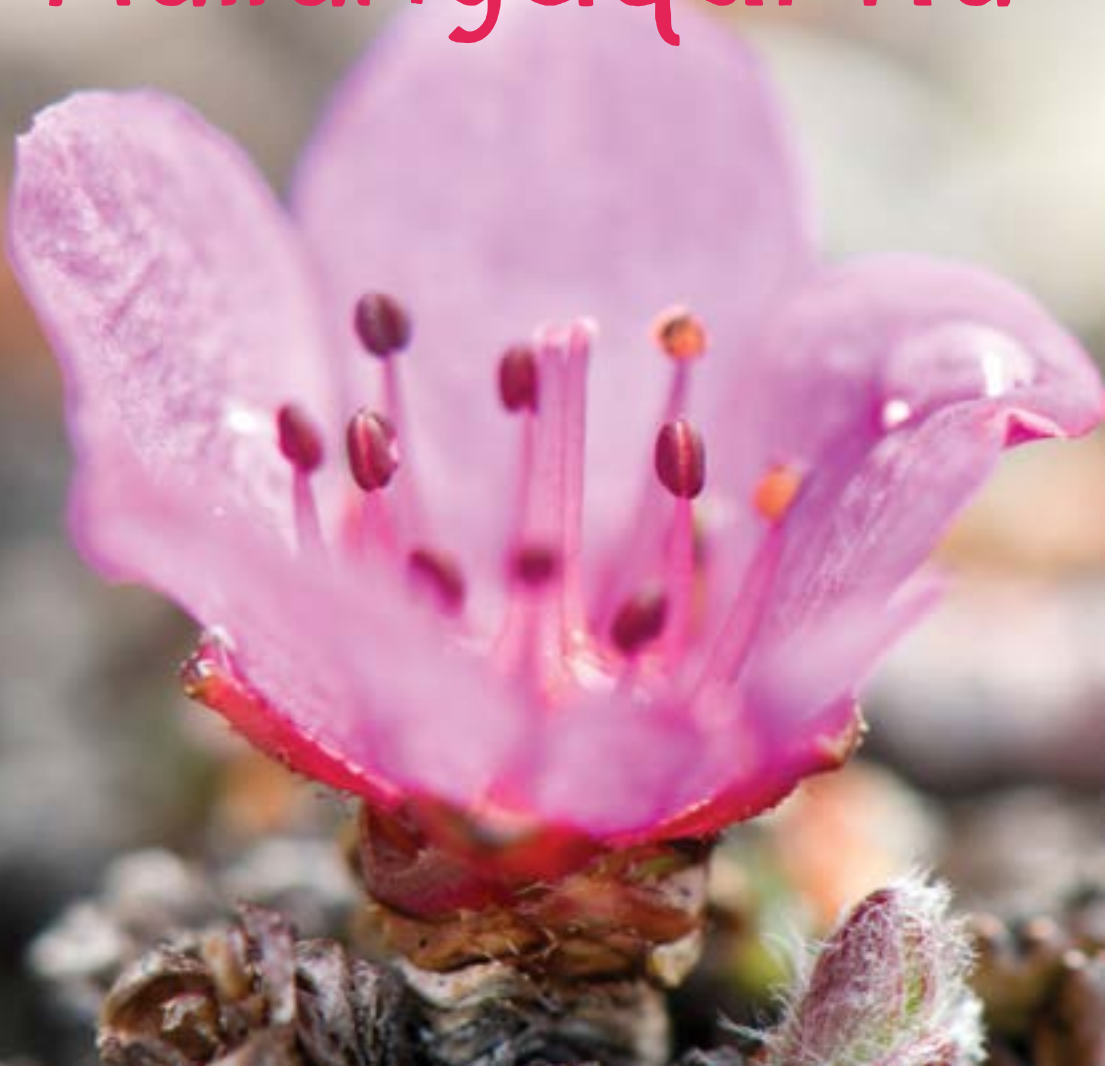

Level 5

- 8–12 pages
- One sentence per page
- Sentences become longer and more varied
- Punctuation includes mostly periods, with very few question marks and exclamation marks
- Highly supportive images help readers decode the sentences



- 8–12 pages
- 1–2 sentences per page
- More complicated and varied sentences
- Punctuation includes mostly periods, with some question marks and exclamation marks
- Highly supportive images help readers decode the sentences

Level 7

- 8–16 pages
- Generally 1–2 sentences per page
- Sentences increase in length and complexity
- Punctuation includes mostly periods, with some question marks and exclamation marks
- Supportive images
